Health Emergencies in Large Populations Jan 6 – 17 2014

H.E.L.P. 2014 (Winter) is a two-week course in public health and nursing in humanitarian emergencies. The course focuses on meeting the needs of refugees, displaced persons and disaster victims worldwide. The course consists of online sessions in December 2013, and class work in Baltimore January 6-17, 2014.

Course content includes:

- Planning, assessment, and evaluation of refugee needs
- Measuring nutritional needs and organizing food
- Meeting needs for water, sanitation, shelter and fuel
- Establishing curative and preventive care
- Controlling the spread of communicable diseases
- Collection, analysis, and use of data in emergencies
- Implementation of relief activities in emergencies
- Provision of reproductive health services
- Protection of women and other vulnerable groups
- Security for humanitarian workers
- Applying International Humanitarian Law to protect populations at risk
- Protecting human rights in displaced populations
