Disaster response in the Philippines: Lessons learned for the future

Monday 17 February 2014

In early November Typhoon Haiyan struck the Philippines with wind speeds of up to 196mph, killing and injuring thousands and destroying homes and infrastructure. The resulting devastation and human suffering caught the attention of the world. The United Kingdom, sent volunteers to assist the affected communities. Their experience was challenging, sometimes quite unexpected.

This meeting aims to highlight the diverse work of some of the agencies involved and share the lessons learned for disaster response in the future. We will examine the medical consequences of an extreme weather disaster and raise awareness of the human cost of Typhoon Haiyan in the Philippines and highlight the work of UK-based medical organisations responding to events in the Philippines and promote opportunities to get involved with disaster relief work overseas.

We will also explore the medical and surgical caseload and practicalities of clinical work in the Philippines disaster response and discuss the lessons learned from this deployment, to be taken forward to future disaster response.
